

this amendment's germane, Senator Horgan. You're the one that wants to amend teachers' salaries into foster care review and doing away with that, the words of the court. That's not germane and you know it. This one's germane as can be. I don't want to...I'll count to ten, I'll lose my temper. I want to try and har...I'll harass, if you want to see harassment, you're going to see harassment. It's not a harassment measure. It's a simple measure and you're wrong, this is not LB 252, Senator Horgan. LB 252 repeals the helmet law. This doesn't do that. This codifies it in LB 958, keeps the helmet law in statute in the State of Nebraska. It's not LB 252. If anybody's misleading the public it's you and this body. I said from the beginning what exactly my intent was, some small change in our statute. Yes, I said from the beginning it ties them together. To give people the ability, if they wanted to, to repeal it, that was not my intent. A very clean, little amendment that's not meant to harass. If I don't have the votes, I go away. It's that simple. If I wanted to harass the bill, I'm not wild on 958, we certainly can see about that. And that's not a threat. I don't plan, I don't operate like that. All I want's a clean shot on my amendment. As a matter of fact, many people involved in the ABATE organization, many people that support my amendment are mad because it didn't go far enough. They want to make it a secondary offense. I don't think that's reasonable. I tried to bring to this body a reasonable amendment that is certainly in order if you're going to talk about rules of the road. It certainly is germane, as the Speaker has ruled. I would wish maybe Senator Lynch would withdraw his motion to overrule the Chair because, even under the most narrow definition of germaneness, this is germane. Let's talk briefly about my amendment. If I don't have the votes, I'll forget about it, but if you're going to try and shut me off this way, maybe harass may come into play because all I'm asking is a simple up or down vote on a simple amendment that is not trying to repeal the helmet law. I guess I had a bill to do that. I couldn't get it out of committee. I didn't try and pull that from committee. This is a simple bill that adds a couple little changes in the helmet law. It ties these two things together. I made it very clear what my intent was. The Speaker has certainly ruled in order. I apologize for taking so much time. If we could move on to a vote on the amendment, we could move on to other things, as we should.
