

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lynch. You've heard the closing on the motion to overrule the Chair. We will now vote on that motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. This vote requires 24 votes to overrule the Chair. Have you all voted on the motion to overrule the Chair? Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: If you waited as long as we can wait, I would ask, I guess, reluctantly, for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. The house is under call. CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2117-18 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 30 nays on the motion to overrule the Chair, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails. Call is raised. We are on the Moore amendment. To speak to the Moore amendment, Senator Withem, did you wish to speak to the Moore amendment?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I do, and I guess what I understand to be the rationale for doing this versus what will actually happen is something I'd like to debate. I'm assuming that the rationale is let's place the helmet law on the same statute with the seat belt law, pass them both, and then let's assume that somebody out there will get petitions circulated and will get petitions, will place it on the ballot and it will all get repealed and we'll get rid of the helmet law that way. I don't think that would happen and I'd like to ask Senator Moore, when he gets up,
