

SENATOR MOORE: I mean, I made it clear in the beginning that I'm repealing the entire helmet law and reinserting the new language.

SENATOR LYNCH: So you are repealing the entire helmet law. So people, at this point in time, if this amendment is adopted, will not have to wear motorcycle helmets. Is that what you're saying?

SENATOR MOORE: No.

SENATOR LYNCH: When you (inaudible)...when you repeal (inaudible).

SENATOR MOORE: I am saying if you adopt my amendment you will have to wear motorcycle helmets. The only changes made in our helmet law is the chin strap and the fine, and I...

SENATOR LYNCH: Okay.

SENATOR MOORE: ..it's no my intent to do anything...

SENATOR LYNCH: Well, that was my original...that was my original question, but then you said, so this amendment will not repeal the motorcycle helmet law, and my original question was it will only repeal those sections of the law that deal with the helmets, the straps and the fines.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, I guess your definition of repeal, once again, I'll just tell you what the bill does.

SENATOR LYNCH: No, just...no, just...no, don't tell me what it does. I know what it...I know what the bill...law does.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay.

SENATOR LYNCH: And your bill deals with helmets.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes.

SENATOR LYNCH: So it eliminates only those sections that deal with the kind of helmets you can have. I was going to ask a question about why that was so important. For example, it says that you don't need to have a visor on the helmet, but that's like driving a car without a windshield, but you know better
