There's nothing unusual about the way that it's drafted whatsoever. What it is, is it does bring these two things together. If there is a petition drive, it may make it easier to get petitions, it may make it harder to repeal. I don't know, but even if it does, I don't have a problem with that. If the people of the State of Nebraska don't want a seat belt law, they shouldn't want a helmet law. That's why I was opposed to the helmet law back in '88 and I'm still opposed to that, but if you have the two...like I said, if you adopt my amendment, I will vote for the bill, I will vote for it on Final Reading. If it's vetoed, I'll vote for the override and I won't sign a petition to repeal either one of them. I can live with them as long as there are two out there. I have consistently had a problem having one and not the other and I guess my definition of harassing a bill is trying to doom it in this body and I'm trying to bring in votes to the bill so I can vote with it with good conscience. That's exactly what I'm trying to do. That's what I said in my opening. I apologize if I offended the introducers of the bill by introducing this amendment, it makes perfect sense to me and always has and I said in my opening exactly what it is I was up to. If you don't like my amendment, vote it down and that's fine. I won't vote for the bill then. I'll vote against LB 958. I won't give another floor speech on it. If you, if Senator Horgan would have been successful in trying to deny me the opportunity through germaneness and overruling the Chair, I would have lost my temper and talked for a good long time. I said in the beginning I want a simple vote. I think it's a reasonable request. I think the two things should be tied together. If there is a petition, that's fine. If there's not, that's fine with me. We have a helmet law. We have a seat belt law. We should either have them both or not have either one of them. I can live with that. I'd ask for adoption of the amendment.
