A rural letter carrier of the United States Postal Service while performing his or her duties as a rural letter carrier between the first and last delivery points is also exempted. I'm much like a rural letter carrier. I'm going a short distance down this road to a specific spot, just like the letter carrier is going from this mail box to that mail box and it says right here in the bill he doesn't have to snap on his seat belt. Well, why not? I mean, he's just as much at risk as I am. The reason is because he's going to, I think, is because he's going to violate the law and you don't want a law on the books which is going to be flagrantly violated. Now, will I vote for the bill if this amendment gets on? That's a good question. But let me say this, Senator Horgan, if this amendment gets on, I will not put up these 40 amendments on the bill. I won't do that. I'll promise that if this amendment gets on, I won't put up 40 amendments on the bill. I think we should have this...seriously, I think that we should have this exemption and I would ask you to support it.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Schimek, did you wish to speak to...Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President, and members of the body, just briefly. Senator Lamb, I thought it was a rural letter carrier and I know what this would mean for rural letter carriers. It would be snap in, snap out, snap in, snap out. But for you or for those that you're trying to exempt it would be one snap in, one snap out, right? Senator Lamb, would you respond to how this equates with being a rural letter carrier?

SENATOR LAMB: Snap in, snap out, snap in, snap out.
(Laughter.)

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No, please, seriously.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, you know, I'm going from field to field. I'm going down to this first field. I'm going to check the weeds and the wheat to see if it needs spray. So I drive a quarter of a mile to the wheat field. I get out, walk around a little bit, then I get back in the pickup. I go on down to the next wheat field or the corn field to check it. It's very similar to the letter carrier. They do that...we do that all the time, it's part of the business of agriculture and very similar to the letter carrier.
