

and that's in the commercial driver's license. You know, there is an exemption which was approved by the federal government that drivers of farm plated trucks do not have to have the commercial driver's license as long as they stay within 150 miles from home. So there is an exemption for farm plated vehicles already as far as...and that's a safety issue. I guess you have commercial driver's licenses, people have to pass that test and it's a safety related issue. But, for farm trucks, that's waived, that's waived. I'm saying, let's do the same thing for the seat belt because, frankly, even though there are a lot of accidents in rural communities, I agree, having the seat belt law is not going to change that because they're not going to use their seat belts. They're just not going to use their seat belt. If they want to use a seat belt, they can do it anyway, they will do it. But the great majority of the people out there that make their living in agriculture are not going to be wearing it except on those occasions when they're going long distances or some special situation. So it's a futile bill as far as agriculture is concerned and all it does is make violators out of those of us who do not like to be violators. So I would ask that the amendment be adopted.
