SENATOR CHAMBERS: I didn't know that so that...I don't think that's the way it should be. But if that's the tradition, I think it should stop. Otherwise, all I have to do, turn my light on and stay away until somebody speaks that I would like to speak behind, then I just come up and I am recognized immediately. Is that the way it is?

SENATOR CONWAY: Your point will be taken into consideration. For now let's stay with this but I will consider that from here on. The question has been called. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CONWAY: Debate is not ceased. Senator Wesely. Senator Beyer.
