

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. I will go to Senator Lamb to close on your amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. Let me just read the committee amendment as it will read with the amendment. Enforcement of Section 39-6103.07 by state or local law enforcement agencies shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been detained for a...has been cited or charged with a violation or some other offense. I'm eliminating the words "detained for a suspected", those words, violation, and inserting "cited or charged with a violation or some other offense. So instead of just guessing as to whether or not there is a violation and you get pulled over for that, for that suspected violation, you really have to have a violation and I think that lends a lot more credibility to what we're doing here and I'd ask that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Lamb's closing on his amendment. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the amendment offered by Senator Lamb. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, it's late in the evening and there are two votes missing. I hesitate to ask for a call of the house but it looks as if that may be necessary. Call of the house, please.

SPEAKER BAACK: A call of the house has been requested.

SENATOR LAMB: Call-in votes would be authorized, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Call-in votes have been authorized. A call of the house, all those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Call-in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Moore voting yes. Senator, you had voted yes, Senator. Senator Elmer voting yes.
