

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, is it one that I just sent up there or was it an earlier one?

CLERK: An earlier one, Senator, page 1, line 9, strike "suspected" and insert "traffic".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, that I want to withdraw because Senator Lamb took care of that.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Then the latest one, Senator, "in ink" as opposed to "read".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what page does it refer to?

CLERK: Page 1, line 21, strike "front-seat". Page 34, line 18...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I've got it, thank you. members of the Legislature, I will tell you what the purpose of this amendment is, then I'll read you the actual language of it, and I hope Senator Jessie "Harassmussen" will listen. This is a situation...well, Senator, combine, I mean Wehrbein is not listening either, but at any rate this is an amendment that will make any person who is a passenger in the vehicle have to wear the passenger restraints and it will make each person not wearing a restraint guilty of an infraction. That way each person is responsible for what he or she does or does not do. So to achieve this purpose, in the committee amendment where you are prevailed upon to exempt all passengers except those in the front seat, you did that by putting the words "front-seat" in
