I think we've been over this bill sufficient and I think we ought to move on and I would encourage you not to vote to reconsider the Lamb amendment and argue that whole issue again. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Horgan. Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I see this is a reenactment of last Thursday and I just thought that I was not going to speak on this bill, but I guess I decided to anyway and, Senator Horgan, I really, my heart goes out to you because I see everybody's bills are dead anyway for tomorrow that are on Select File that haven't been covered yet and so there goes the session, so I really apologize. I do have an amendment, I did have an amendment and it meant a lot to me too. It was heard in Transportation Committee and it was the only one that...the only committee that was familiar with it and I did pull it from your bill because I didn't want to belabor the bill any longer. Although I oppose your bill, I did pull my amendment from your bill and I don't intend to support your bill, but since we are playing our games that we played last week again on the floor I would just like to say that I don't wear seat belts and I don't intend to wear seat belts and I have a son that is alive and healthy and well and married and has two children. They would have been dead if he had worn his seat belt and I guess that's one of the reasons I feel the way I do about seat belts. And if anybody wants documentation for it, I have records at Columbus Community Hospital and the police department in Columbus that he would have been dead if he had his seat belt on and I know that's a minor statistic. I know that's one of a few, but that's my reason for opposing your bill, Senator Horgan. I wish you luck for the rest of the night and thank you.
