SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, the insurance company would pay the fees.

Based on the way it is done now in, for example, in federal court when they are awarded, they look at all the different factors that go to how much time has been put in, the different factors that go into those types of claims. It's a process that we know how it works. I'd simply urge the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. You've heard the closing on the amendment offered by Senators Lindsay and Coordsen. We will now vote on that amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
