SENATOR BEUTLER: (Microphone not activated.) ...closing, Mr. President, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Okay, Senator Beutler waives closing. Those in favor of the Beutler amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Requires 25 votes. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion carried, the amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kristensen would move to amend, AM3830.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, what I have here is the original bill, 1195 which was before the Judiciary Committee. This is the clean-up bill left over from the court of appeals from last year. During the last year the bill drafters found some inconsistencies, found some changes in wording. There is no substantive changes in here. We figured this bill would be a consent calendar bill, however, there was never another consent calendar. It did come out of the Judiciary Committee clean, 7-0, including Senator Chambers voting for it. It makes very few changes, however, the changes that are made are basically in the areas of wording. For example, where we make references to the court of appeals or to the Supreme Court we just strike that, put the word appellate court in so there is no confusion about that you could go to both courts. It's clear from the other language but these were clean-ups that we did not catch during the first draft of the bill. The first bill that we passed last year was approximately 190 pages long and changed about 150 sections. These were ones that we had left over from those changes and I would be glad to answer any questions. There is no policy changes that are here and none are certainly intended at all. With that, I'd urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Coordsen.
