SENATOR WARNER: No further lights, Senator Kristensen, do you wish to close? Senator Kristensen waives closing. Those in favor of the Kristensen amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment to the bill.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Coordsen, do you wish to move the bill?

SENATOR COORDSEN: I have one question to answer of Senator Lindsay's. Apparently I mis...misused some words in the English language in addressing the Beutler amendment. The Workers' Compensation Court, in its current state, can still conduct pretrial conferences if the court so desires. The Beutler amendment removes the staffing and the fiscal amendment, fiscal note, fiscal impact of the bill. So if that was an adequate explanation, Senator Lindsay, I would just simply move 360.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, members, I rise also to support the bill. When I first pushed my light it was just to clear up what Senator Coordsen was talking about. The court can still do pretrial conferences like they have been doing or scheduling with the pretrial conferences with a judge or especially in pro-se cases. What the Beutler amendment did was take out additional staffing for that purpose and a requirement of pretrial conferences using those staff members. So I would concur with Senator Coordsen and would urge the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Coordsen, your light is still on. Those in favor of advancing LB 360 say aye. Opposed nay. Motion is carried, the bill is advanced. The Clerk has items to read into the record.

CLERK: Very quickly, Mr. President, Enrollment and Review
