SENATOR LAMB: Debate has ceased. Senator Robak, to close.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I would just say and it's not out of frustration, it's just I think we should go in sequence the way the rest of us have had to go, so I just move the bracket motion. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is to bracket the bill. Those in support vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Twenty-five votes required. A roll call vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2130-31 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 18 nays to bracket, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion to bracket fails. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe we're back to discussion of Senator Beutler's amendment, AM4295.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, members, we're debating LB 835A. LB 835 was an appropriation bill for...change provisions relating to the CHIP assessments. I think even probably anyone would agree this is clearly nongermane under Rule 7, 3(d). I would challenge germaneness of this amendment since as you're amending totally different into this A bill and 30 votes would have to be required to do that. So with that, I'd challenge germaneness, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Beutler, did you care to respond?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Lamb, the amendment deletes all provisions of the bill and, therefore, there is nothing in the bill for it to be germane to. It is an amendment in and of itself and is, therefore, obviously germane.

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair rules that the amendment is not germane. Mr. Clerk. Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you rise?
