to reduce as revenues reduce. That's part of the reason and the...

SENATOR CROSBY: Because it would be like...it wouldn't be something, as you say, an ongoing project, wouldn't necessarily be ongoing.

SENATOR WESELY: For instance, on the health care side, we'd use it to match grants and some things and we need to have some flexibility and I think, obviously, we recognize that ultimately they can't sustain an ongoing program.

SENATOR LAMB: Thirty seconds, Senator.

SENATOR WESELY: I'm sorry. But that's the best answer I can give you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wesely. I just thought that that should be brought out this evening because I have one good friend who wrote me and said she had been paying for Devaney Center and all these places all these years and they won't let her smoke in them. It is a little bit ironic when you stop to think of it that you help pay for something and then you can't go there and use what you are giving to pay for a place. So...

SENATOR LAMB: Time.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...it's catch 22 in some ways. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Conway, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. President and members, I rise for the purpose of asking for a division of the question. I think, without question, as you read the bill, starting with the first ten sections, it talks about the Environmental Trust Fund and we get into the Sections 11 to 12 and it talks about creating a Cancer Research Fund and then Sections 13, 14 spins off to a University Facilities Remodeling Fund. As we keep moving through the bill, they are, in essence, literally stand alone pieces of legislation all packaged together under one particular proposal, so I filed with the Clerk where I would like to see those divisions. There are what I believe to be seven very specific divisions where the divisions ought to be debated. These are all specific issues to be addressed and I think those divisions as filed with the Clerk...and I'll recite those again.
