Sections 1-10 I think is one; Section 11-12 is another; 13-14 is the third; 15 and 16 would make up the fourth; 17, 18 and 19 would be the fifth; Section 20 and 21 included in the sixth; and then, even though there could be divisions as well on the funding mechanism, I'd be willing to see all of the funding mechanism debated together so the balance of the bill then would be the seventh division. I would request...

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair rules that the question is divisible. Senator Beutler, could you indicate which of these divisions you would like to take and in what order? Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just for the purpose of some help. If that was the division that was going to be accepted, could they be read again so we'll know that that is going to be the division that we'll be dealing with?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CONWAY: Okay, we'll pick them up...

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Sections 1-10, which is the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund section, is one. Section 11 and 12 which creates a Cancer Research Fund which is Section 11 and 12 would be the second division. The third division would be Sections 13 and 14 which is the University Facilities and Remodeling Fund. The fourth one would be Sections 15 and 16 which creates the State College Remodeling Fund. Sections 17, 18 and 19 which is the Solid Waste Closure Fund. Section 20 and 21 combined which deals with the bingo tax and the redistribution of lottery proceeds and the like would be the sixth division and then all of the funding mechanisms following after Section 21 would be the last division.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Conway, perhaps it would be better if you would approach the bench and discuss the order with Senator Beutler. The Chair would like to take this opportunity to introduce the staff members who are staying at this late date under the north and south balconies. How about the newsmen and women.
