

regard to the appropriateness or inappropriateness of the inclusion of materials that were presented. In any event, that's not a critical question. What is critical is how much time we want to spend on this particular debate, how we can get together and structure something that, hopefully, makes sense in the context of this situation. And, finally, I would remind you that if the parties were so inclined, it could be a three-step process, the motion to overrule the Chair and two suspension motions, both of which require 30 votes and are very difficult. Beyond that, of course, the opposition can make it longer if they so choose. I would hope not too much longer. Just long enough, I would hope, so that there is a thorough and fair debate on the bill. Would ask that the Chair be overruled.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing on the motion to overrule the Chair and I will announce before we take the vote that all 49 members are here so it takes 25 votes to overrule the Chair. We will now vote on the motion. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, I suppose I would just ask for a roll call vote, Mr. Speaker. Are all the senators here? Did you indicate?

SPEAKER BAACK: We are not under call.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Then I guess I would ask for a call of the house also.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for the house to go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Nelson, would you check in, please. We are looking for Senator Dennis Byars. All members...all members are now present and we have a request for a reverse order roll call from Senator Cudaback. Members, please keep your conversations down so the Clerk may hear your responses. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.
