

make sure that there is an end to that window of opportunity because contractual obligations or bond obligations may spring up after that time. This amendment was written by a Baird-Holm bond attorney to make clear that solid waste projects are covered basically under the limited referendum law. Arguably, they are already, but this makes this perfectly clear in who does this stuff. Bond attorneys do this kind of stuff. They want everything written out very neatly with a bow and this is that bow. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I rise to support the amendment. Again, we think this...they have the ability now. This clarifies it so once the...they have good notification and good hearing procedures that it's all still in the open and they have the ability to come and discuss the project, but once a project gets started and the money has been committed it gives them only a certain period of time before they can come in and do the limited referendum. I think this is something that's needed as proven by the limited referendum statutes and this capital construction of landfills should be included in it, as I think it already is.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Any other discussion on the amendment by Senator Landis? Seeing none, Senator Landis, do you wish to close?

SENATOR LANDIS: Waive closing.

SPEAKER BAACK: Waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Landis. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the amendment by Senator Landis. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the amendment by Senator Landis? Record, Mr. Clerk.
