CLERK: Page 2062, Senator.

SENATOR LANDIS: I would...Mr. Clerk, this is the amendment that I thought we had passed before. This is the one on limited referendums, which means is that the amendment that we had previously adopted I will need to check so that we can identify what it is. This measure is the limited referendum that I had discussed or that's why I was surprised to see there were two names that were called for me. Let me remind the body, and I will do a quick search on what the other one was, but this one has to do with making it clear that solid waste proposals are, in fact, subject to a limited referendum and I would urge its adoption. I can't undo what we've already done without having a chance to work back, but this is good policy and we should do it. I would urge its adoption. And I will approach and identify our previous amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Any discussion? Seeing none, we will now vote on the Landis amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Landis's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Morrissey and Beutler now would move to amend with AM1257. I'm sorry, AM4206.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Morrissey...or Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is the required response to federal legislation that we call the Clean Air Act. It's really the responses to amendments to the federal Clean Air Act that...that requires legislation on our part in order to set up standards as required by the federal law. LB 10...or LB 12...this particular bill came out of committee five to one and with two absent. It is, to my knowledge, with perhaps one exception, noncontroversial. The provisions basically do a number of things. First of all, they set up a permit fee system and in that regard you might look at the Section 62 of the bill which has guidelines that are to be followed for setting up air pollution regulations.
