

and million here and a million there. There's 8 million bucks on registration fees. There's another 8 million bucks on occupation tax. There's another million and a half here. At some point in time we've added \$100 million to the taxpayers load that never shows up on the tax rolls. I said it again, and I can be forgiven because I'm not Jim Exon's staunchest supporter, but he used to always caution about it. He said, put it on the sales tax and income tax and then face the music; if you can't dance to that tune, don't dance. And, ladies and gentlemen, we're going to do it. We're going to come in the back door and finance these programs through every possible scheme available, and the public is going to be fed up with it. So, I guess I'm not going to...probably won't support the amendment. But I'm getting very, very close to not supporting the bill, Senator, and I don't want to do that to your bill. And so I just caution you on it. I just...I know I don't need to caution you, because you are well aware. But you put too much time on this bill to have it scuttled at this moment. And therefore, I'm going to just say this is enough. If the FIFRA dog comes down, I'm going to put a collar on it and lead it out.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The cap is on, yes. Four thousand tons per year...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...is the cap.

SENATOR HARTNETT: All right, thank you.
