

do this. They'll say who did this? Who is making us do these things? And then you're not having a good teamwork situation. This is one where Senator Rasmussen has the hammer to say you are going to have to deal with this issue. You are going to have to do this. And, oh, by the way, if you think there's a better way, this amendment says you can come up with your plan but it has to be approved by the Crime Commission. And if it's approved, we're going to let you do it and you're going to feel more comfortable because it's your plan. But if it doesn't work, if the Crime Commission says, no, then you got to do this plan as in 1184 and you're going to have to institute it the way that Senator Rasmussen has it developed. And I, at this point, urge adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing. We will now vote on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Conway would move to amend, Mr. President. (See pages 2156-60 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. I have a very quick amendment that I think we can address and move along and have Senator Rasmussen's bill in shape for advancement. What I am offering to you is in the Government Committee. We heard a bill brought to us by Senator Bernard-Stevens, we advanced out of committee on a 7 to 0 vote. What it does and all that this amendment does is puts juvenile detention centers under the Jail Standards Board and the Crime Commission like our other detention centers are, other places of incarceration. The juvenile detention centers which are springing up, there's one in Wayne, Nebraska, that I'm familiar with that's a 22 county joint effort to have program there is not under any particular oversight of the Crime Commission nor the Jail Standards Board. They have no construction standards or other standards that they fall under. And what this would do would be simply to identify in the statutes in the statutes addressing the responsibilities of the Crime Commission which has the Jail Standards Board that
