SENATOR MOORE: ...to make the whole process of the enterprise zone work, we have a request for funding by this body, I hope the body will remember that there was an A bill with LB 1240, and for whatever reason that I am not going to hypothesize on, that A bill disappeared. I hope they remember there was a chance to fund it then, that later on down the road is not the proper time to fund it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Rod Johnson, you are next.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members, I would ask a question of Senator Hartnett.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hartnett, would you respond, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Paul, I haven't followed this bill real close but I have been told that really now it only applies to the City of Omaha.

SENATOR HARTNETT: No.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: That is not true?

SENATOR HARTNETT: No.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Can the smaller communities in the state qualify?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, there is about four or five counties, Senator Johnson, who would qualify under the bill right now.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Okay. Okay, that is all I need. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't particularly intend to say anything until Senator Moore spoke, but maybe it is a good time, and I don't want to take much time so we can get to the A bill, but the practice used to be that the following two years upon the enactment of legislation, that is what the fiscal note is expected to...or the A bill is expected to fund is the money. And the way the Legislature gives direction to an agency as how important a
