or with the Bill Drafters Office and they inform me that they are bottled up with the amendments with the Clean Air Act being amended into LB 1257, that they are going to be hard-pressed to be done by midnight starting at seven o'clock. So if I move that deadline and we don't get done with the income tax until seven-thirty, we will not have the bill back anyway by midnight, and it has to be back with us by midnight, and that is the time frame that we are operating under.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I will withdraw my motion at this time to allow us to proceed to other measures, and I will renew it after six-thirty.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. It is withdrawn. We will now proceed to LB 1059.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1059, first item for consideration is E & R amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 1059.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 1059. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Beutler, AM4088, Senator. (See pages 2162-63 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I have done, Senator Wickersham has done some long and hard, we've both done some long and hard thinking on LB 59 (sic) and we have both made some very big compromises and we are together on the bill. And what is happening essentially, I'll mention a couple of elements of the compromise and Senator Wickersham may want to pick up on the remainder. But the main elements of this particular compromise is on the one hand the districts will be reduced from 21 to 12 as in my original bill, 1059. On the other hand, that part of 1059 that eliminated three judgeships will not be in the bill. In other words, the districts will
