I remember, before the session started Governor Nelson said that because of the busy session, and the property tax problem, that he had decided not to press this bill this year. Then I think some members of this body convinced him that the bill should be advanced this year. And so with that encouragement then he came back and said, well, yes, we do need the bill this year. I think with that sort of waffling back and forth it doesn't convince me that it really does need to be advanced this year. And I have to be convinced also that, compared with other states, we have a faulty income tax system. I'm not convinced we do. And so with all those things in mind, I'll be voting against suspending the rules.
