PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1099A passes. LB 1184.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1184 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1184 pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2271 of the Legislative Journal.) 48 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1184 passes. LB 1184A.

CLERK: (Read LB 1184A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1184A pass? All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2272 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 1 excused and not voting, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1184A passes. LB 1192.

CLERK: Madam President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Wickersham would move to return the bill. (Wickersham amendment appears on pages 2272-73 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Madam President, I'll try to be brief. It's really not my intention to take a great deal of time with this motion. I have passed out the amendment that I would suggest be adopted if the bill is returned to Select File. I want to talk about this bill a little bit because I didn't have much of a recollection of the General File debate. I don't think there was any on Select File. I do remember Senator Lindsay explaining the bill just briefly and then we moved on very quickly. But as I reviewed the bill before Final Reading, two things became apparent to me. One, it would represent a substantial increase in an existing tax. Even though we're
