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mirrored exactly the language that is used for our Committee on Committees process and, if that's a problem, then we should be making rule changes requiring the Committee on Committees to follow the recommendations of the caucuses. They don't have to by the rules. I guess we could, if we wanted to, form different coalitions. As a matter of fact, Committee on Committees don't even require that the people come from the caucus areas. We could, in theory, form a coalition with the Chair of the Committee on Committees and two caucuses and stack every committee that...I say "we" assuming I'd be on the winning side, or they might be stacked against me. That's under our current rules in terms of Committee on Committees. We don't do that. We allow the caucuses to do their own...own work and we follow their recommendations. That was mirrored, we mirrored that same language that's there for Committee on Committees with this process so that that same process would take place, so that the committee could not, as a matter of fact, the rules change does indicate, unlike the Committee on Committees, it does go further and say two people from each Executive Board caucus will be chosen and it is the full intention that those will be recommended by the caucuses. If we need to change that later on next year, I'd sure be happy to do that. With that, I do think this is a way. We have, this session, had some rancorous moments. We've had some good moments. We've left some things unresolved. We've resolved lots of problems. This is one festering problem that has been out there, been...we've been dealing with it all session, around it. This is a way of resolving it. I would urge you to vote in favor of this rules change. And I would request a call of the house. Oh, yes, Senator Lynch did remind me that this is an amendment to the standing rules. It is not adopting new rules. This does require 30 votes. It is not, a simple 25 votes will not do it, so 30 votes will be required. Thank you for reminding me to remind people of something you forgot to remind them of. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.
