

April 14, 1992 LB 718A, 718

Proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2281-82 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 16 nays on the override, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The veto is overridden. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Will would move that LB 718A become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President. This shouldn't take any time. This is a cash-funded bill. It is the companion bill to LB 718. It is \$90,000 in cash funds to fund...to implement the provisions of LB 718. I would move that we override the veto on this bill as well.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Will a question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Will, at what point will this money have to start being spent?

SENATOR WILL: This money will start being spent with the implementation of this legislation, I would assume. However, unless remote facilities are actively being implemented, then I would assume that the money wouldn't be actively spent.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you and others say that there will probably be a court test of this bill and the tracks have already promised to take one?

SENATOR WILL: I would...yeah, I would think that that is the case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And will that case be filed immediately, as far as you can gather?
