

SENATOR HEFNER: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I don't believe we have had sufficient debate. Senator Robinson. Anyone else wishing to speak to this motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Will?

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President. Just simply to say that I think it is a good policy to pass A bills along with implementing legislation in general. I think this is an example that does not depart from that policy. Obviously, there will be rules and regulations that have to be adopted by the commission. That may entail some cost. They may, obviously, pay people salaries in order to develop those rules and regulations. I think the best policy is to override the veto on LB 718A as well. I would urge your support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. We will now vote on the motion to override veto. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, in the interest of time, I'd ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would the senators please return to the Chamber and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. The house is under call. Would the senators please check in. Senator Haberman, please check in. We are looking for Senators Morrissey, Wickersham, and Rod Johnson. We will proceed with roll call vote on the motion to override.
