And one thing that I see as being tragic in all this, the fact that Senator Crosby, as she pointed out, and I can cooperate on so many things, it's ironic that less than 90 days ago, maybe less than 30 days ago, she and I can cooperate on an issue such as chlamydia and Pap tests for women, then she finds it necessary, based on her principles, to condemn things that I have said as being inappropriate and a disappointment to all women. My final comment. I'm taking this time because this is an unusual situation. My comments were addressed to one person who happened to be a woman. My comments were addressed to that person because of what she is doing, not because of what she is. They were not addressed to her as a woman because she is a woman, my remarks were addressed to her as an Assistant Attorney General who I feel is misusing that office, who is overzealous in the pursuit of getting the state to kill somebody. And were she sincerely in pursuit of justice as the Attorney General's Office should be, she should be as anxious as I am to have the court resolve this very serious issue before trying to hasten a man to his death.
