SPEAKER BAACK: The report is adopted. We will now go...it does not appear on your agenda, but we will proceed now with a confirmation report offered by Education Committee. And Senator Dierks, I believe you're going to handle that report.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Any discussion of the confirmation report of the Education Committee? Seeing none, we will proceed to vote on the confirmation report. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report as offered by the Education Committee.

SPEAKER BAACK: The confirmation report is adopted. We will now go back to the other confirmation report from the Banking Committee. Senator Abboud, I understand you're going to handle that. Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABOUD: Yes, Mr. President, colleagues, we have two appointments for the Nebraska Research and Development Authority. Both of these individuals were approved by the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee. Connie J. Day to the Nebraska Research and Development Authority; and Margaret Hornady, also to the Nebraska Research and Development Authority. They appeared before the committee and were approved by the members in attendance on a five to nothing vote. So I would urge the confirmation of these two nominees.
