Income producing property that is an example, a tractor that's...that's owned by a plumbing contractor in Omaha, Nebraska ought to be...if that ought to be on the tax rolls, so should the same tractor that's owned by a farmer out in rural Nebraska. Logically, Senator Beutler has cut through an awful lot of pain, an awful lot of agony to get us to where we ultimately will probably be anyway if we ever do find a resolution to this issue. You have a choice. You can vote this down. You can then see LR 1 not pass, LB 6 not pass, adjourn in deadlock and ultimately we're going to come around to where Senator Beutler is now. So if you would like to short circuit everything and come to what will be the logical conclusion, you will vote for Senator Beutler's amendment. At that point then, I think, a number of us that were not supporters of LR 1...

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR WITHEM: ...could become and we can actually get something accomplished this session. I urge you to support Senator Beutler's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Senator Kristensen, you are next.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members of the body, Senator Beutler, just from a point of...so I know where this is going, in your amendment you have it listed on page 8, line 9, that's...there's no page 8 in any of the...either in the regular LR or in the amendment. So I guess we probably need to make sure that we get this...I'm just confused about where it should go. Should it go on page 4 after line 11?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Kristensen, for purposes of amending committee amendments, as I understand it, they look at the lines so that you see on page 1 of the committee amendments you have lines 1 through 21. That's page 1.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And 1 through 24 is 2, 3, 4. In terms of the pagination at the bottom of the page, it is page 4, after the first line 11.
