SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: (Microphone not activated immediately.)  
...Legislative Chamber. Roll call.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: I might announce I know it says on the agenda that we are going to go to the election of the committee chairperson, but we still don't have quite a full contingent here.
