SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: ...than they are in his district and I think he understands that very well. But, I guess, I wish if several senators, like Senator Hall, would be less concerned about trying to treat my people fairly, and more concerned about doing some things for theirs, I think we could all get out of here quicker. But that's beside the point. But as far as I'm concerned, LB 6 is something that I think, given the court ruling, either we need to enact LB 6, or Senator Schmit's point of view, that you simply extend 829 for future years. If you don't do that now, you're going to have to do that come January 92, it's going to have to be one way or the other probably, Loran Schmit, you're absolutely right, if you don't change the Constitution. But it's certainly my opinion if LR 1 is not going to the voters, I'm in no hurry to do LB 6, it's as simple as that. I think the combination of the two, at least at some point in time, a few weeks ago, was something I thought would be palatable to at least enough members to get 40 votes...

SENATOR WARNER: Time.

SENATOR MOORE: ...since that time maybe the goal posts have been moved to some degree, that is no longer the case. But this time I'm voting no on LB 6.
