

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President and members. The Committee on Committees would ask the body to confirm the committee report on the election of Senator Bohlke to Business and Labor, Urban Affairs, and Government Committee. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Does anyone wish to speak to the committee report? Seeing none, we will now vote on the confirmation of the committee report. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of the Committee on Committees report.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The committee report is adopted. Proceed with Item 8, General File, Select File.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 6 was the bill originally introduced by the Revenue Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on July 12, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. The bill was discussed yesterday, Madam President. At that time, amendments were offered. I do have amendments pending. I have a priority motion pending, however. Senator Baack would move to reconsider the amendment as offered by the Revenue Committee.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Madam President and members. This is actually Speaker Baack's motion to reconsider but along with Speaker Baack I was also excused when this motion failed to advance, and I guess at this time I would ask that the body, indeed, reconsider the amendment. I know it's not actually the committee amendments, am I correct, Senator Hall. It is the Hall amendment as endorsed by the committee, is that the correct title for these amendments? Okay. So it is not the committee amendments. I think this is an amendment that is, indeed, cleanup of LB 6. I think it is something that we need to...obviously, in my opinion, you need to, if we are going to move forward with LB 6, this is the proper way to do it, and so with that I would ask the body to support the motion to reconsider the amendments, the Hall amendments to LB 6, so we can continue that debate and eventually adopt it.
