SENATOR HALL: Senator Haberman, the amendment that was adopted by the committee, which is in front of you, was gone over in executive session, if I remember right, two different executive sessions at two different points during the same day, and it was adopted by the committee on a vote of 5 to 3. You (interruption).

SENATOR HABERMAN: This amendment was not before the committee, though, was it?

SENATOR HALL: Clearly, it was.

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, not in this form?

SENATOR HALL: Meaning the hard copy.

SENATOR HABERMAN: This copy that is before us, the 72 pages.

SENATOR HALL: No.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, thank you, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: But the amendment that we adopted...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you very much.

SENATOR HALL: The amendment that is before you was in front of the committee because that is what we voted on.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Members of the body, I think it would be irresponsible to reconsider and/or pass legislation that now consists of 72 pages. All of the additions of the Governor's bill I believe did not have a public hearing. There are members of the committee who have told you it was not gone over verbally section by section. It is a mix of the committee's ideas and the Governor's ideas but they have not and were not brought before the committee and discussed verbally. I think we'd be very irresponsible to reconsider this issue, and if it does have the votes to reconsider, we'd be very irresponsible by passing it. So, therefore, I ask you to oppose the reconsideration of LB 6.
