SENATOR HALL: I understand, and I...

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Madam President, members of the body, I have several disconnected thoughts here, so I hope that you will bear with me. Just about the time I feel that I've got a handle on this thing, something else comes up in the discussion on the floor that makes me realize that I'm not 100 percent sure on every aspect of this and how it impacts us. I guess I'd be willing to stay an extra day, if it meant that we could consider on General File today, and then Select File tomorrow, and then Final Reading on Saturday. Or I'd be willing to stay an extra two days, or I'd be willing to stay a week, or I'd be willing to stay a month, if it took that to do it. I'd also be willing to go home. But I'm afraid that, if we go home and come back in the regular session to address this issue, that we will have so many other distractions that we won't be able to concentrate as we're concentrating here. So my preference is to stay here until we come to some kind of conclusion to this question. What I really...what really triggered me off, a few minutes ago, and the reason I didn't speak a few minutes ago was the exchange between Senator Hall and Senator Schmit regarding LB 6 and the constitutional amendment. And I guess, Senator Hall, I would like to try to clarify, in my own mind, what happens if both LB 6 and the constitutional amendment pass.

SENATOR HALL: I'm sorry, Senator Schimek. Could you repeat that, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yeah, I'm trying to clarify, in my own mind, what you and Senator Schmit were talking about a while ago on the floor. It concerned, I believe, Senator Schmit's question as to what happens if both the constitutional amendment and LB 6 pass. In your explanation of the committee amendments you do say, number five, that this adds language in which exemptions are reinstated and dates are adopted, et cetera, et cetera. If
