SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a motion for call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please check in. The house is under call. Senator Ashford, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Would the senators please return to their seats and record their presence. Senator Warner, Senator Bohlke, would you please check in. Senator Pirsch, please check in. We will proceed with a roll call vote on the Baack amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 117-18 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 15 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. I will raise the call. Are there further amendments on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator Abboud, you have the next amendment. Madam President, Senator Warner would move to amend.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President and members of the Legislature, by the way, let me say if the constitutional amendment was approved by the voters, should it get on the ballot, I would be perfectly willing to pull back that exemption in 775. I would not intend to jeopardize the legislation. I just simply don't believe that you can pick that little piece out in earthmoving equipment. And the only reason the big four is covered, if any of you didn't hear the discussion at the committee hearing, those items that were covered by the court were what was based on the filings in 1986 and 775 didn't exist in 1986.
