PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay, for your closing. We will now vote on the Lindsay amendment to LR 1. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 121-22 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 14 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have, Senator Haberman is excused, Senator Ashford, your amendment, Senator. Madam President, Senator Hall would move to amend.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: What is the amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, this is the one, "Taxes other..." You are reinserting the same language in a couple of different places.

SENATOR HALL: Is that the one that Senator Wickersham brought?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: Okay. Madam President and members, the amendment is unfortunately I do not believe available to you. It is being printed though and it will be out here very shortly. All it does is add in the constitutional amendment...well, it is technical in nature. Let's see, okay, no, actually it is only one, and in a couple of different places, I think it is page 8, line 17, page 9, line 13, along those lines, it adds language, and the language that it adds is technical only in this way. It says currently we have a provision, if you look at, I guess it would be page 2 of the committee amendments and it would be page 1 to page 4 of the green copy, so it would be the second page of the committee amendments, the first line 3 and 4, where it says, "The necessary revenue of the state and its governmental subdivisions shall be raised by taxation in such manner as the Legislature may direct."
