CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators, please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Senators Baack and Beutler, please check in. Senator Landis, Senator Moore, Senator Nelson, Senator Robak, and Senator Rogers, please check in. Senator Wesely, Senator Lowell Johnson, please check in. The senators will please be seated. We'll proceed with roll call vote on the Elmer amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 126 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment fails. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Moore would move to amend.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President, this amendment, in the event that LR 1 would indeed pass with the voters, this would move the levy date, instead of being effective January 1, move the date effective to March 1, with the thought being that the old argument why do you start taxing something until you know exactly what you're going to do with it, the thought being that if you pass LR 1 and you pass LB 6 in its present form, you have things...everything back on the tax rolls, and it's going to take 30 votes to change any of them, we had that discussion early in the session. Then if you really mean you're going to take that exemption away, you don't just start it January 1, you start it March 1. But I guess at this point in time I'll withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Hall.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Will would move to amend.
