PRESIDENT MOUL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT MOUL: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Our chaplain today is Senator Coordsen from the 32nd Legislative District. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. I now call to order the Tenth Day of the Ninety-Second Legislature, First Special Session. We will proceed with roll call. Please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Madam President, a report of registered lobbyists required by statute that was filed as of July 18, 1991; and the annual report from the Department of Motor Vehicles on file in my office. That's all that I have. (See pages 130-31 of the Legislative Journal.)

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Morrissey, as Chair of the Committee on Committees would report on the recommendation that Senator Schmit replace Senator Schellpeper on the Retirement Systems Committee. The report is found on page 115 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, the Committee on Committees received a letter from Senator Schellpeper desiring to resign his position on the Retirement Committee in light of his election to the Chairmanship of the General Affairs Committee. And we went to his caucus and they chose to replace Senator Schellpeper with Senator Schmit. The
