We need to deal with this.

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: But we need to deal with it under conditions that allow for serious debate where we can address all the problems that face us, not just a constitutional amendment that solves nothing. Whether they vote it up or vote it down, LR 1CA, in its present form, doesn't solve a damn thing. It doesn't. Take a look at it. This, at least, gives us an opportunity to find out where the voters are. If they trust us...do they trust us to go into session in a regular time in January and deal with this in a responsible way? I think they will. I think this is something they can live with. They will have time to talk to you, and you will be back there so they can listen to how you feel about the tax issue, and then we will be back down here and we will be at a general election. It will be 30 votes instead of 40.

SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR HALL: And I don't lose the uniformity clause overnight because 20 percent of the people happen to get 51 percent of the vote. I would urge you to support this amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. List of speakers, Senator Moore, followed by Senator Warner. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Pass.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner. Senator Warner passes. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. President and members, I have a question for Senator Hall, one or two questions.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall, would you respond, please.

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR LAMB: Now under your scenario here, we would amend LR 1 with your amendment, and then LB 6 would disappear into the woodwork, is that correct?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Lamb, in my opinion, frankly, LB 6 is
