We are not going to get that done. I can't support LR 1. I can't support LB 6 the way they are written now, no matter what, but I could support something like Tim had going before. I understand that there is some talk going on here, and that Senator Lindsay has some thoughts, and I am going to be willing to listen to just a little more, but before this afternoon is over, if we don't get anywhere, we might as well put up the sine die motion and go home because we are not going to get anywhere anyway. Senator Lindsay, I yield the rest of my time to you.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Elmer. Thank you, Madam President.
