

paid less. I don't have a problem with a tax break for business. I voted for some of them. I do have a problem with saying you're not going to do it, and then doing it. It's kind of like...kind of hard for me to quote a "Fritz" Mondale, but it's kind of like Ronald Reagan saying he won't raise your taxes, I just said I will. It's one of those things where they said they wouldn't do it and it did happen. It was...you know, that article will be coming around. It had a tremendous impact on those big boys that, the ads they paid for, said you were going to get. Secondly, the homeowners, time and time again the Governor in articles said it was unimaginable, unimaginable that homeowners taxes would go up under this measure. Senator Hall, myself and others continue to say that may not be totally true. The Governor said it would be unimaginable that it would happen. What happened in Lancaster County? What's happening in Douglas County? Obviously what has occurred and once again, as we've said time and time again would happen, there's not more personal property on the tax rolls, there's less personal property on the tax rolls, 20 percent less here in Lancaster County, 15 percent less in Douglas County. Now, I'm not critical of any one for saying that it was an inexact science, but we all agree that's what it was. But to base your ads and to base the whole campaign on that business personal property is going to go up, homeowners are going to get a tax break, when you know darn good and well that's not going to happen, I guess I have a problem with that. And as we continue to look at this measure, and it's too late to change it for this year, we have to live with LB 1063, we have to live with LB 1. I think it's important that we continue to remind people what they were sold is a bill of goods, by some people. And I'm not critical of people in the Legislature. I'm critical more of the ad campaign, which I...the day it came out I called some of the people involved in that and said, that's not the right way to do it, you're not being fair to the people of the State of Nebraska. It's obvious now that I don't think they necessarily...necessarily were. But, nevertheless, Amendment 1 did pass, unfortunately. In my opinion, Amendment 1, at least for tax year '92, was a referendum on LB 1063 and we have to live with it.

SENATOR MOORE: Next year may or may not be the time to revisit that battle. But we simply cannot forget some of the things that were said by the proponents that simply were not...arguably were not accurate at the time, and time has now told they
