depreciable. And so, because they are depreciable, then they are taxed. So, here we are, two neighbors in the same business, I am tax free, he's being taxed, it's absolutely, completely unfair. We have an Attorney General's Opinion that says, in effect, that with the passage of Amendment 1 we do not need to, we can get by without having a property tax on breeding livestock. And so that's the reason I had the amendment printed. Sixteen people signed on with it. I have other people that also want to join in that I found. However, it seems not to be prudent to try to put it on LB 1, that most people in this body think that LB 1 should go forward in its pristine form. And so, as a result of that, it seems more prudent to make the attempt to put my amendment on LB 3, which will be, as I understand it, on Select File tomorrow. So, with that in mind, Madam Chair, I would withdraw the amendment and I will reinstate it on LB 3. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. If there are no objections, the amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Madam President, I have nothing further pending to LB 1.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 1 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to advance LB 1. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 1 is advanced. I'll recognize Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President and colleagues, I think that what we will do right now is we will stand at ease for a few minutes. We are going to get one of the redistricting bills back here, and we will be able to proceed with that in just a few minutes. So we will just stand at ease right now until we get that bill back, and then we will go back into session.
