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SENATOR PETERSON: With that small of...just two districts or mainly one there would be no problem. It would be different than...I was assured that, anyway.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, and that...

SENATOR PETERSON: Absentee ballots, if you leave them in it, shall be available for the election by August 25th. The last day for voter registration for a special primary election shall be August 26th and the sample ballots shall be published after August 27th but before August 31st.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, assuming that we finish on time in here, and I think we're scheduled to finish on August 12th.

SENATOR PETERSON: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So that would leave what, about nine days or so? What was the date you said?

SENATOR PETERSON: August 21st.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Twenty-first. Okay, thank you very much.

SENATOR PETERSON: Uh-huh.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Does anyone else wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Peterson? Do you have closing, Senator Peterson?

SENATOR PETERSON: No, I think it's all in there. They can do the canvassing by the county canvassing board shall meet on September 3rd and the canvassers in the county and the other one would be by the 8th, and recounts necessary shall be made on September 11th, and the Secretary of State shall certify the names of those candidates by September 14th. So I know it's a hurried-up process but I think it's a lot fairer and I think my people would like it, in fact, in talking to several of them, would prefer it. And I think we deserve a primary. So I ask for the adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Peterson. We'll now vote on the Peterson amendment. All those in favor please vote aye,
