CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Schrock's and Elmer's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of LB 15 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance. We do have a request for a machine vote on the advancement of LB 15. Discussion on that. Senator Elmer, did you wish to discuss the advancement?

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would like to add a few comments that were not brought out in the debate last week. Since the debate and the first vote, I have received a resolution from the Imperial Chamber of Commerce that says, Now, on this 5th day of August, 1992, the Imperial Chamber of Commerce hereby endorses the modifications to the redistricting of legislative districts pertaining to District 44 and number 38 as contained in 615 or 16, which, of course, of all those bills, 15 is what was brought to us by the Government Committee. The Imperial Chamber of Commerce urges the Nebraska Legislature to strongly consider the above stated legislative bills in order to preserve the unity of interest in southwest Nebraska. Along with that, we have resolutions from the Chamber of Commerce at Benkelman, the Chamber of Commerce of McCook, the Chambers of Commerce of Maywood, Curtis and Eustis, and informal statements that I've gotten from Superior and some of those other places. With that, I would urge the body to advance LB 15 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Elmer. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I have in my hand a resolution from the Holdrege Chamber of Commerce positively supporting LB 15. And I would like to state that I have received no opposition from any constituent in
