CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 9 is returned, so we will now deal with the amendment. Senator Conway, did you wish to explain the amendment further?

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members, the amendment now is...now that we've brought it back and we discussed it thoroughly, I think, in terms of the request for bringing it back, what it does is simply clarifies any potential conflicting language relative to having more than two on the ballot if you use the petition technique when there has been a district change between a primary and a general. So that's as it was discussed, that is what it is and I would prefer its attachment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Conway. Any discussion? Seeing none, do you wish to close, Senator Conway? He waives closing. We will now vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Select File amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move the readvancement of LB 9 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 9. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Mr. Clerk, the next motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to return LB 9 to Select File. Senator, I have AM039S in front of me. Pull that.

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn.
