It came out of committee that way and that's the one that...to say it's a \$9.2 million Select File amendment is not totally complete, to say it's a \$4.2 million probably is correct. Secondly, Senator Withem talks about the concern for a tax shift and, obviously, 1063 in and of itself was a nice tax shift from the business sector to the ag sector and to the homeowners. And so if we want to talk tax shift, if we want to talk new standards, we ought to talk about that. But I really don't want to be in a position to defend LB 3, particularly Senator Lamb's amendment. I voted for it. I would question whether or not it was in the call. The thing that I am concerned about though is that, that bothers me, is that why didn't somebody try and deal with this on Monday? Why didn't the opponents of Senator Lamb's amendment try and deal with it on Monday when we had a free day there that we could have done it? I waited around all day for somebody to file something and it never happened. All of a sudden yesterday, everybody starts putting the screws here to everybody to keep the whole bill from advancing. I mean, if people were earnestly trying to fix things, they had plenty of opportunity on Monday to try and do it. I think Senator Withem is very sincere and I would be with him. If we wanted to stick around and fix some things till Friday, I would be more than happy to seriously consider Senator Lamb's amendment. I would do that. I know Senator Withem is sincere on that. Maybe if this amendment is adopted, I guess, I'm going to ask the question of the Speaker. I'm assuming the motion to adjourn sine die is on the agenda. If we adopt this amendment, I'm assuming that motion is still there and if we wanted to stay around, we have to vote no on that. Correct?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore, if we would decide to return this bill and we have to wait until Friday, we would just take that motion away. We wouldn't even consider that motion today. If that's what the body decides to do, then that...you know, work days we have to have a layover day and so then tomorrow would be the layover day and then we would have Final Reading on Friday. That's why there were a couple of extra days built in so that we could possibly do that if it's necessary.

SENATOR MOORE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Well, you know, given that, I would maybe even consider Senator Withem's amendment because I also think Senator Warner hit on a point on the sales tax in Senator Coordsen's amendment that I think may have gone beyond what many of us thought it would do. I think Senator Coordsen's amendment was brought to us from the thought that why
