PRESIDENT MOUL: There are sufficient seconds. We will now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I'd like...excuse me while I clear my throat, please. It is hay fever season and things are not going too good for me. Well, I will tell you, now I look around here and...come one, come on. A call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please...the Clerk just reminded me we are on Final Reading. The house is already under call. Would the senators please check in. Looking for Senators Chambers, Conway, Senator Schmit, and Senator Will, Senator Robak and Senator Rogers. Senator Robinson, would you accept call-in votes on the motion to cease debate? We will accept call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Will voting yes. Senator Rogers voting yes. Senator Robak voting yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 10 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate has ceased. I will recognize Senator Hefner for closing.
