the rest of my time, if you want to talk about how you think that should occur.

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CONWAY: Let me expand on that just a hair in that it's really not a situation where we need to statutorily give the Secretary of State, who only has concurrent jurisdiction to begin with with all the other county attorneys in the State of Nebraska, the authority to go nullify those certificates of election. Those certificates of election under my meager understanding of law would be nullified by virtue of the fact that the candidates, in order to qualify to be a candidate, must reside within their district, and if, in fact, their district no longer exists but that number and geography is transferred, or I should say the number is transferred, the geography wouldn't be transferred, but that number is transferred to Madison County, that, in and of itself, makes them illegal candidates for general election when, in fact, they no longer live in a district that is up for election and, therefore, you know, it'd be a sequence of those kinds of other statutes that would follow.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. If I could follow up on that, their certificate of nomination says District what on it?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR CONWAY: It would say District 19, but they no longer qualify for District 19 because they are no longer residents of District 19.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Wouldn't that go to their serving and not to their election? And, then, I will let you finish on your time.

SENATOR CONWAY: Yeah, since we are over time, maybe we need to...
